YOUTH SPORTS

YOUTH TACKLE FOOTBALL: Registration for this fall program is from April through July 31st. It is open to children entering 2nd-6th grades in the fall and who live within the School City of Mishawaka boundaries. A physical is required annually for this program, as well as a copy of the child's birth certificate. Confirmation of grade advancement is required prior to conditioning. Conditioning starts August 5th with practices beginning typically the first week of school. This program teaches the basic fundamentals of football and has become a feeder system for Mishawaka High School's football program. Registration fee is \$75.00; however, a sliding fee scale is available for additional children playing in league.

FLAG FOOTBALL: Registration for this fall program will be August 17th through August 23rd. It is open for children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade. Practices begin shortly after registration and will be held in Merrifield Park. Games will be on Saturdays, typically in September and October, and will be held in Merrifield Park. Registration is only \$25.00 per child.

TOT SOCCER CAMP: Children ages 3 through 6 can learn the basics fundamentals of tot soccer at an age appropriate level. Participants learn such skills as dribbling and trapping, boundaries, passing and kicking, shooting and scoring, and throw-ins. This program also emphasizes exercising, being a good listener, being a team player, and sharing. Shin guards are suggested but not required. Participants receive a colored t-shirt for wearing during practices. The program runs for one full week, weather permitting.

Entry/Registration

Registration is from **8:00-8:45 A.M.** Saturday, September 19th on location at Steele Field. Registration for PPK is **FREE!** Competition begins promptly at **9:00 A.M.** All contestants must fill out an Entry Form/Release of Liability. Children must be 8 to 15 years old **and show a valid birth certificate** for age verification (age is determined as of December 31 of the current year). Entry/Registration Forms may be completed at PPK or picked up in advance at the Mishawaka Parks & Recreation office, 600 E. Third St. in Mishawaka.

Age Groups

The four age divisions are: 8/9, 10/11, 12/13, and 14/15 with boys and girls competing separately. One winner from each of the boys' and girls' four [4] age divisions will move on to compete at an assigned Sectional Competition.

The NFL PEPSI PUNT, PASS & KICK program was developed to teach boys and girls teamwork, athletic skills, and the fundamentals of punting, passing, and kicking. It offers boys and girls ages 8-15 the opportunity to compete individually against their peers while having fun developing skills and an appreciation for the game of football.



In the winter months it is the best place to enjoy some fast-paced inner tubing. "The Hill", is home to one of the top ranked, more picturesque disc golf courses played by professional disc golfers within the country. The basics of disc golf are like that of club golf. The two sports are similar in that they both have "drivers" and "putters", have 18 "holes" (disc golf uses baskets), and use "par" and "bogey" to tally scores. Scoring requires one to throw a Frisbee-like disc into a metal basket with chains.

The "Tubing Hill" satisfies the need for speed as you fly down the snowy hills with the wind in your face. Just in case the snow is too cold, Wilson Hill has a large warming area which has a fire place as well as furnace heat. Next time the snow falls at least 4", you may want to think about bundling up in layers and coming out to the Hill for some winter fun. It's a great way to spend the day with the family!



Chapter 50 of the Municipal Code for the City of Mishawaka (regarding Parks and Recreation) reads in part:

“(A) The hours of operation of each municipal park shall be established by the Board of Parks and Recreation. The Parks Superintendent shall post the hours of operation in a conspicuous place in each park, and shall be authorized to enforce the closing of the parks by appropriate measures. He shall also be authorized to grant extensions of the closing time to the holders of park use permits for special functions as hereinafter provided.”
