# AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF MISHAWAKA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2023

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MISHAWAKA, INDIANA, THAT:

Section 1. The biweekly salaries of the following elected officials of the City of Mishawaka, Indiana, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2023 shall be payable in 26 equal biweekly pay periods beginning January 6, 2023 in the following amounts:
