

The **Normain Heights Neighborhood**, a national historic district, highlights the city's focus on accessibility and opportunity for 70+ years.

A local nonprofit developed **300+** homes between **1947-1949** to provide affordable housing for WWII veterans and their families.


Normain Heights Park was built in the early 1960s to help deepen the connection among families in the neighborhood.




